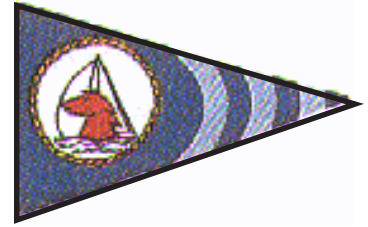

Joint Bellingham/Langley Power Squadron Picnic – May 1, 1100 – 1600hrs

The Langley Power Squadron will join with the Bellingham Power and Sail Squadron for a picnic at the Peace Arch State Park – American Kitchen.

The American Kitchen is located close to the parking lot on the US side of the park, but it is accessible from the parking lot on the Canadian side without using a passport.

Surrounded by 20,000 flowers, this building has stunning views of the San Juan Islands, Point Roberts, Vancouver

Island and the magnificent Peace Arch that was built in the early 20th century on the United States/Canadian border.

Features: Meeting or dining area with fireplace; kitchen with triple sink, refrigerator and stove; large outdoor picnic area and 20 picnic tables; covered stage; indoor tables and chairs for 100 people; restrooms adjacent to building; accessible to those with disabilities. A 3ft x 3 ft barbeque grill is provided.

Come and meet your fellow boating enthusiasts from across the border. The two squadrons will have a joint rendezvous at Port Browning May 21-23.
