Looking to upgrade your knowledge in electronic navigation? Want to know more about how to fully utilize that recently purchased unit? Maybe you're looking at making the plunge and adding new electronics to your boat but feel a need to know more about it before you commit? Langley Power Squadron is offering a pair of courses that will get you well prepared for this years boating season.

Electronic Charting (Thursdays, Mar. 6, 13, & 27. 1900 -2200 hrs)

Learn about the different kinds of EC, how they were developed, their advantages and disadvantages, how to use them in a practical manner. You learn about connecting your GPS to a laptop, desktop, PDA or tablet computer. There is information about the use of navigational programs for computers. You get practical knowledge about EC by utilizing a great program that is included on the accompanying CD. The CD has a variety of features and includes over 200 electronic charts and an EC program that displays and uses these charts. You can put your PC computer to work as a practical learning tool by running this program.



Recommended pre-requisite: Boating Course

RADAR for Pleasurecraft (Thursdays, April 3, 10, and 17. 1900 -2200 hrs)



This course covers the different types of RADAR equipment, including their capabilities and limitations. Understand the available features and how they apply to your needs. Learn to navigate using RADAR, and to determine where you are. Course materials include the RADAR for Pleasurecraft text book, and a CD (PC only) containing a RADAR simulator

Courses are \$60 each for CPS members, \$70 for non-members, OR take BOTH courses for \$100/120 (member/non-member).

BOAT INSURANCE

DO WE TRULY UNDERSTAND IT?

Unfortunately, it was recently necessary for me to examine my boat insurance policy after a break in and a considerable number of items were stolen. During my initial look at the insurance policy, it indicated I had Hull insurance, coverage on the dingy/tender and motor and Personal Contents.

My first concern with the insurance policy was that all the items stolen had to

My first concern with the insurance policy was that all the items stolen had to be covered under the Personal Contents portion as the Hull coverage seemed to indicate a complete loss/damage to the hull itself. I contacted my insurance company and was advised of the following. The Hull Insurance covers anything



that is attached to the boat, such as radars, inverters, GPS units, etc., as well as life jackets, flare guns and any other items that are legally required to operate the vessel. The size of your boat will dictate what those items are. Items that are not covered are those that are not attached by screws/bolts, etc. such as depth sounders with the black screw knobs. The general rule is that one must require some type of instrument to remove it, and if it can be removed by hand, than it is not covered under this portion of the policy.

It was also brought to my attention that another area of concern with boat insurance is what is actually stated on your policy as being the Hull Insurance. Because of the impact of the Canadian dollar vs to US dollar, there has been a

negative impact on the value of boats. Should you have a major insurance claim on your boat, you could find the insurance company will not honor the value as stated on your insurance policy, but will pay out only the actual cash value of the boat as determined by them. It is critical you examine your insurance policy and ask the proper questions of the insurance broker to ensure you are not paying for an insurance value that you can never use..

I would recommend contacting your broker and determining an understanding of what is insured under certain portions of the policy, such as — What is covered under the Hull Insurance? What is not covered under the Hull Insurance? What is covered under the Personal Contents portions and what is not covered. Also ensure you will be paid the value of your boat as indicated on your insurance policy, not an adjusted value after the fact.

Another factor, is the simpler the insurance policy the better. The least amount of fine print attached to your policy, the better. The fine print, for the most part is there to protect the insurance company, not you.

I have also been advised you are better to remain with one broker and not be changing on a regular basis. Unlike ICBC who maintains a record of your claims, there is no central registry for boat claims. They are maintained at the agent level only.

The sole purpose of this article is to alert you to the potential pitfalls of boat insurance. It is recommended you contact your broker to ensure you know the answers to specific questions before you actually need to ask them.


4)Aug 15-17 Otter Bay
